# Health Outcomes: 39th out of 67 counties \*improved from 2023


Health Outcomes tell us how long people live on average within a community, and how much physical and mental health people experience in a community while they are alive. Health Outcomes includes quality of life and length of life.



Baker County is faring worse than the average county in Florida for Health Outcomes, and worse than the average county in the nation.

# Health Factors: 39th out of 67 counties \*declined from 2023

Health Factors represent those things we can improve to live longer and healthier lives. Health Factors include health behaviors, clinical care, social and economic factors, and the physical environment.



Baker County is faring worse than the average county in Florida for Health Factors, and worse than the average county in the nation.

Areas of Strength: low rate of sexually transmitted infections

**Opportunities for Improvement:** higher rate of uninsured individuals, high rate of preventable hospital stays, high air pollution particulate matter





# **NEIGHBORHOOD & BUILT ENVIRONMENT**

### **Geography and Governance**

Baker County was founded nearly 160 years ago. This county encompasses approximately 585 square miles of Northeast Florida immediately west of the metropolitan city of Jacksonville, 140 miles east of Florida's capitol Tallahassee, and 45 miles north of the University of Florida in Gainesville. The county contains almost 4 square miles of water in its lakes and rivers and many miles of undeveloped woodlands. The Osceola National Forest covers roughly 220,000 acres of the northern part of Baker County. The five-member elected Board of County Commissioners represents the citizens of Baker County. Each elected member represents a district within the county but is elected countywide.

# **NEIGHBORHOOD & BUILT ENVIRONMENT**

### Social Vulnerability Index (SVI)

Social vulnerability is a set of factors such as poverty, lack of access to transportation, and crowded housing that may weaken a community's ability to prevent human suffering and financial loss in a disaster. An area receives a Social Vulnerability Index Score (SVI) from 0 to 1.0 in which 0 is the lowest vulnerability and 1.0 is the highest vulnerable population.

**Socioeconomic status** (below 150% poverty, unemployed, housing cost burden, no high school diploma, no health insurance)

**Household characteristics** (aged 65 or older, aged 17 or younger, civilian with a disability, single-parent households, English language proficiency)

Racial and ethnic minority status (Hispanic or Latino (of any race); Black and African American, Not Hispanic or Latino; American Indian and Alaska Native, Not Hispanic or Latino; Asian, Not Hispanic or Latino; Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, Not Hispanic or Latino; Two or More Races, Not Hispanic or Latino; Other Races, Not Hispanic or Latino)

Baker County's overall SVI rate is 0.6188, which indicates a medium to high level of vulnerability compared to other communities. This means that Baker County is more likely to experience negative outcomes during emergencies, disasters, or disease outbreaks. When considering thematic SVI, the Housing Type and Transportation Status factor has the highest SVI (0.7051), and the Household Characteristics factor (0.4073) has the lowest.
